

What's Whois to you?




How does outdated data affect us?

- Confusion over resources custodianship
- Increased overhead for network troubleshooting
- Negative 'word of mouth'
 - Customer services, company reputation and community reputation
- Increasing invalid contact reporting
 - Over 100 reports monthly average
- Breach of membership agreement
